Procedures for Forms and Finances Mission to Bloomington

All participants are responsible for completing all the forms in this packet and submitting them, with your application fee, by the Application deadline.

Here's what should be included in your envelope:

- (1) Application
- (2) Assumption of risk
- (3) \$50 application fee/check
- (4) Personal Reference
- (5) Church/Spiritual Background

Be sure to thoroughly check that all the forms are filled out completely (if forms are incomplete they will be returned to you for completion and this will delay the application process).

Upon the application deadline, or prior to, mail all required forms along with your \$50 check in an envelope to Evergreen Community Church (address below).

Application Fee

Your \$50 application fee, upon acceptance, will be credited towards the total that you are required to raise for the mission trip. You may pay the full amount yourself (upfront with your application fee if you want) or you may raise the support from others and mail that in by the support deadline.

Support Raising

If you will be raising funds to support this mission trip, you must download and read the Support Forms documents before beginning your fundraising. These documents include guidelines, sample letters, and all the forms you need to submit with your payments. If you are writing a check for the full amount, you will not need to download these forms, just remember to put "Mission to Bloomington" and your own name in the memo portion of the check so we can put the funds in the proper account.

All contributions, including those given by you, are tax-deductible. Since these gifts are tax-deductible there can be not refund once the checks are cashed.

We truly look forward to serving alongside you and appreciate the many sacrifices you are making to join us in impacting people for Jesus Christ. FUNDING FOR MISSION TO BLOOMINGTON

\$50 Application Fee:

Please include a \$50 check made payable to Evergreen Community Church. Make sure you write, "Mission to Bloomington" and your name in the memo portion of the check.**

If you are part of a family that will be participating in MB, you only need to send in one \$50 application fee per family. Upon acceptance, this \$50 gift will go towards your mission trip account. If you are not accepted the money will be returned to you. Note that once you are accepted and your check is cashed there will be no refund.

Additional Trip Funds:

The minimum gift amount to be raised by an individual or the first participant in a family is \$250. The second and third participants from a family must raise a minimum gift amount of \$100. There is no cost for additional family members. So, the maximum amount that a family needs to raise is \$450.

For individuals who wish to participate only during the evenings and weekends the gift amount to be raised is half of what it is for a full participant. That means that an individual or the first participant in a family must raise a minimum of \$125 and the second and third participants from a family must raise a minimum of \$50. There is no cost for additional family members.

Evergreen Community Church Assumption of Risk for Mission to Bloomington Volunteer

Note: This form is for use by adult volunteers (18 & older) who participate in Mission to Bloomington.

Because Evergreen Community Church may not have insurance to cover injuries or accidents that occur on such trip we ask volunteers who participate on such trip to assume all risks associated with them as a condition of their participation.

I, _____, in consideration of my acceptance as a volunteer on Mission to Bloomington sponsored by Evergreen Community Church, represent and agree that:

1. I am a volunteer and not an employee of Evergreen Community Church.
2. I am aware of the hazards and risks to my person and property associated in a mission capacity, such hazards and risks including, but not being limited to, death or injury by accident, disease, war, terrorists acts, weather conditions, inadequate medical services and supplies, criminal activity, and random acts of violence. I accept my assignment with full awareness of these risks, and subject to any insurance coverages that may be available to me from any source, and only with respect to Evergreen Community Church and its agents, officers, directors, and employees. I voluntarily assume all risks of death, injury, and illness associated with such risks, and any damage to my personal property, and I release Evergreen Community Church and its agents, officers, directors, and employees from any liability whatever arising as a result of death, injury, or illness that I may suffer as a result of participation in the mission project. I further recognize that such risks have always been associated with missionary service (2 Cor. 11:23-28).
3. I attest and certify that I have no medical conditions that would prevent me from performing my duties.
4. I expressly waive any defense to enforcement of any provision of this commitment arising from a claim of lack of consideration and warrant that this commitment constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation upon me enforceable against me in accordance with its terms.
5. I am aware of the hazards and risks to my person associated with participation in a short-term mission trip, as described above. I further understand that Evergreen Community Church may not have any insurance coverage that would apply in the event of my death, illness, injury, or damage to my property that may occur during my participation on the trip, and that if I desire insurance coverage I am responsible for the cost of such insurance.
6. I expressly agree that this assumption of risk agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by law. I further state that **I have read the foregoing assumption of risk and understand its contents, and I voluntarily sign this release as my own free act. This is a legal document and I understand that I have the opportunity to consult with an attorney before signing it.**

Mission to Bloomington

About the Bible

We believe that the Bible is the Word of God. God spoke through chosen people who were the authors of the sixty-six different books in the Bible. The Bible is not considered a story, but rather, an anthology of true accounts of history by the different authors. The Bible is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament starts at the beginning of the world and ends before Jesus Christ is born. The New Testament starts with the birth of Christ and ends with the book of Revelations. The first four books of the New Testament are different accounts of the life of Christ written by four of his disciples. We believe that the Bible (also called the Scriptures) is true and that over time, the Scriptures were copied very accurately from their original manuscripts. We consider the Scriptures to be the final authority on different issues in the faith and practice of Christianity. They are the only writings that exist that are inspired by God.

About God

One of the mysteries of the Christian faith is that we believe in only one God, but that God is represented by three persons - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is called the Holy Trinity. The different persons of God have different qualities and functions. God the Father, created the universe and the world we live in. He created animals, plants and everything else in nature. He also created humans who exist as the image and likeness of God. They were created to rule the earth and to have a relationship with God.

About People

Because God intended to have relationship with human beings, he gave them their own free will and the ability to choose whether or not to follow God. Right from the beginning, humans decided to be independent from God and go their own way. This created a rift between God and people. Since people wanted to be independent, God became like a stranger to them. No matter how hard they tried, they were unable to get back the relationship they had with God. Since the time when human beings turned away from God, all individuals have suffered from the consequences of being separated from God. We see evidence of this in the different injustices large and small that happen in everyday life. We also see this in ourselves. Because we are not perfect, we can try to reach out to God on our own, but we will always fall short. And when God reaches out to us, our independent and sinful nature gets in the way and prevents His presence in our lives.

About Jesus Christ

The second person of the trinity is God the Son who is Jesus Christ. Jesus is the Son of God and was born of a virgin named Mary. Jesus is God in the form of man. Like other people, He was tempted by sin but instead chose to live a perfect life, obedient to God. He serves as a sinless example for all people in his actions and words. Because God loved us, He came to earth as Jesus to give people a way to restore their relationship with Him. Jesus voluntarily paid for the sins of all humans by dying on the cross and receiving the judgment we deserve for our own sins. When He rose from the dead, Jesus ascended into heaven and now rules with God. At the end of the world, Jesus will return to earth to judge the living and the dead.

About Salvation

Salvation means receiving the grace or forgiveness of God and having our relationship with Him restored. To receive God's forgiveness for our sins, we need to ask Jesus Christ to come into our life and become our Savior. By realizing that we can't reach God by our own actions or good deeds, we know that Jesus Christ is the only way to salvation. Jesus is the One who bridges the gap between God and people.

About Human Destiny

All people will eventually die. The question is, what will happen after you die? For the people who have accepted Jesus, they will spend eternity in the presence of God (heaven). God will reward them for their life of obedience and service to Him. For the people who haven't accepted Jesus, they will spend eternity apart from God (hell). Their existence will be one of pain, frustration, and despair.

About the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person in the Trinity. Before Jesus went to his death, he told his followers that he would be leaving, but that he would send a helper or counselor called the Holy Spirit. After we ask Jesus into our lives, the Holy Spirit also comes into us to renew us, guide us, and motivate us to live according to God's Scriptures. The Holy Spirit also gives each individual special gifts or abilities to help them in their service to God. If, by faith, we tap into the Holy Spirit, we are then able to become more like Jesus and to reveal to others that we belong to God.

About the Church

The Church is the entire body of people who believe that Jesus Christ is Savior and Lord. The Scripture commands believers to gather together to devote themselves to worship, prayer, teaching of the Bible, observance of baptism (by immersion) and communion, fellowship, service to the body through the development and use of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and to teach others about salvation. Wherever God's people meet regularly and do these things, this is considered a local expression of the Church. Under the leadership and guidance of pastors and other appointed leaders, the church members are to work together in love and unity, serving as an example of Christ.

About Faith and Practice of Christianity

The Bible is the final authority in all matters. We recognize that there are some issues that are not specifically outlined in the Bible. On these matters, each believer is to go by his or her own conscience and convictions, led by the Lord.
